In Britain we will look for common ground in seemingly conflicting formal approaches. Our tolerance towards ambiguity will increase. We will learn to look beyond the obvious unity of material and linguistics and acquire new expressive freedoms.

We will look at the work of Edwin Lutyens, James Stirling, Su Rogers, among others. We will discuss the idea of the composite figure with our British colleagues.
